

2026 Crop Year Planning

Between now and March 15th, for OH, IN and PA, (February 28th for MS) is the time to review and make changes to your crop insurance policy. Crop Insurance Changes for 2026

There are many changes to crop insurance driven by the OBBBA (One Big Beautiful Bill Act) that boost subsidies, extend benefits, streamline rules and expand coverage options. These changes make protection more accessible and affordable with decreased premium costs.

Higher Subsidies:

Supplemental Coverage Option (SCO) and Enhanced Coverage Option (ECO) subsidies increased to 80%, up from 65% in 2024. ECO and the similar SCO options provide additional area-based coverage for a portion of the underlying crop insurance policy deductible.

Subsidies for underlying (MPCI) Multi-Peril Crop Insurance coverage levels have also increased by 3-5 percent making policies more affordable.

ARC/PLC and SCO linkage removed. Producers can now purchase SCO regardless of whether they selected ARC or PLC for their base acres, which was previously a restriction.

Beginning Farmer/Rancher Benefits (BFR/VFR):

Beginning Farmer and Rancher Program now offers 10 years of increased tiered subsidies for crop insurance, up from 5 years previously.

Prevented Planting:

The “insured” requirement has been removed from the “1 in 4” rule for prevented planting payments reducing administrative burden. **However, the option to purchase additional buy-up coverage for prevented planting (PF5) has been eliminated which was a popular option.**
